### **Reflection**

**“Everything thing that happens in this world happens at the time  
God chooses”.**

**The first question would be” what is a wise way to spend your  
time”? St Paul advised the Ephesians “Be careful how you live, not  
as unwise people but as wise...” He is telling us to use the time we  
have sensibly, not wasting what God has given us. As some of you  
know, I do a lot of sewing and quilting and when we were told we  
would have to stay home, I was really pleased, I could sort out my  
sewing room, which I did. I found lots of pieces of work, started but  
not finished, I filled a box of these “UFO’s” (unfinished objects),
