Reflection

The lockdown has given us the opportunity to reflect on God's place in this world as we've watched the many news related programmes on television.

They've left me with two concerns about the strategy and management of Covid-19 and the lockdown.

The first is the absence of God in the daily briefings we view. We are shown and have explained diagrams, charts and figures about the science behind any decisions but no reference to the creator of this science!

I hadn't noticed this until I was woken one morning by the noise of a lorry in the road outside. It struck me it could be for the "garden waste collection" and I'd forgotten to put the bin out the evening before. I

looked through the curtain and sure enough it was and it was outside our house.

I grabbed my dressing gown and rushed outside only to see the vehicle going further down the road. I called to a garden refuse operative if I was too late. "No" he said and told me he would come for it. He took it from the side of the house to the vehicle which he got to stop. He handed back the bin saying "God bless you". I was really grateful at what he'd done and I gushingly thanked him for putting himself out for me. He smiled "Look after yourself, God bless you" and left to catch up the vehicle. WOW!

I was left overwhelmed at what had just happened.

In worldly terms, a mere garden refuse collector was doing a mundane job, but God was obviously at the centre of his life and it showed by going the extra mile and caring for someone.

Watching the televised briefings etc, it could be fair for someone to say "Where is God in all this, what's he doing about it".

The garden refuse collector points the way.

Jesus needs hands, feet, eyes, ears and mouths to work his healing power and the Holy Spirit is enthusing people to use these skills to help all those in need. The need is great with many people having to go extra miles in their jobs.

Volunteering to help out in so many ways which we joyfully read about, hear about or see on our TV screens. People, in answering God's call, taking responsibility in some way to mitigate the disaster of Covid-19. Some of course taking on great responsibilities when dealing with life and death situations.

I've edited the Gospel passage, only to tell the story of the younger son.

Just reading it at face value, the younger son opts to take his inheritance early. With it, he is taking on the responsibility to manage it. He gets carried away with the life style he leads until he finds his wealth has all gone. He could blame all the hangers on, but too his credit he doesn't.

He is his own boss, but the money originally came from his father and he is accountable to him. With responsibility comes vulnerability. Do you accept you've made mistakes or do you brazen your way through it as "it wasn't my fault"? The son realises he would be better working for his father than staying in his present situation.

He returns, full of apologies, repentant at what he'd done and he wasn't asking for any favours.

Which leads to my second concern regarding Covid-19. It's really an extension of my first concern.

There have been 40,000 + deaths in the UK. The leading number in Europe. For each death there are family members caught up in it, as well as friends and maybe work colleagues. The number hurting swells.

Then there are those who are seriously ill but recover, and again its family and friends etc who will be distraught with anxiety.

To all these numbers are people who are really worried about those with underlying health problems.

Then there are those who've been ill but fortunately not too seriously.

We add to this, people with other illnesses or conditions who can't be seen.

There are millions who are affected in this country.

In the world – millions upon millions.

To apologise for allowing this to happen, particularly if there are alternative strategies available, can be seen as a sign of weakness.

In God's world however, the Kingdom of God,

- repentance and apologising are strengths.

With responsibility comes vulnerability, the choice between honesty or hiding it. God gives us the courage to speak the truth.

Repentance is so much deeper than platitudes and words of apology.

The young son in the Gospel passage is a good example.

If it wasn't for the lockdown, I wouldn't have met the garden refuse collector who has made my experience of lockdown so much richer.

God, the three in One, is at the heart of this calamity.

People may not realise who is calling them to help, but they are answering God's call. He gives them the strength to go on, maybe against all odds.

Without their response, it's too frightening to contemplate what could happen.

God has done so much for us, and he continues to do so.

Maybe the love of God, the light of Jesus and the fire of the Holy Spirit will inspire the messengers of the "science" to allow the glory of God to shine through.
